## The Liturgy of the Word of God

<sup>1</sup>But Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest <sup>2</sup>and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any belonging to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. <sup>3</sup>Now as he journeyed he approached Damascus, and suddenly a light from heaven flashed about him. <sup>4</sup>And he fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" <sup>5</sup>And he said, "Who are you, Lord?" And he said, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting; 6but rise and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do." <sup>7</sup>The men who were traveling with him stood speechless, hearing the voice but seeing no one. 8Saul arose from the ground; and when his eyes were opened, he could see nothing; so they led him by the hand and

brought him into Damascus. <sup>9</sup>And for three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

<sup>10</sup>Now there was a disciple at Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, "Ananias." <sup>1</sup>After these things Jesus shewed himself again to the disciples at the sea of Tiberias; and on this wise shewed he himself. <sup>2</sup>There were together Simon Peter, and Thomas called Didymus, and Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, and the sons of Zebedee, and two other of his disciples. <sup>3</sup>Simon Peter saith unto them, I go a fishing. They say unto him, We also go with thee. They went forth, and entered into a ship immediately; and that night they caught nothing.

<sup>4</sup>But when the morning was now come, Jesus stood on the shore: but the disciples knew not that it was Jesus. <sup>5</sup>Then Jesus saith unto them, Children, have ye any meat? They answered him, No. <sup>6</sup>And he said unto them, Cast the net on the right side of the ship, and ye shall find. They cast therefore, and now they were not able to draw it for the multitude of fishes. <sup>7</sup>Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved saith unto Peter, It is the Lord. Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he girt his fisher's coat unto him, (for he was naked,) and did cast himself into the sea. <sup>8</sup>And the other disciples came in a little ship; (for they were not far from land, but as it were two hundred cubits,) dragging the net with fishes.

<sup>9</sup>As soon then as they were come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and fish laid thereon, and bread. <sup>10</sup>Jesus saith unto them, Bring of the fish which ye have now caught. <sup>11</sup>Simon Peter went up, and drew the net to land full of great fishes, an hundred and fifty and three: and for all there were so many, yet was not the net broken. <sup>12</sup>Jesus saith unto them, Come and dine. And none of the disciples durst ask him, Who art thou? knowing that it was the Lord. <sup>13</sup>Jesus then cometh, and taketh bread, and giveth them, and fish likewise. <sup>14</sup>This is now the third time that Jesus shewed himself to his disciples, after that he was risen from the dead.

And he said unto him, Lord, thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee. Jesus saith unto him, Feed my sheep. <sup>18</sup>Verily, verily, I say unto thee, When thou wast young, thou girdest thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldest: but when thou shalt be old, thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry thee whither thou wouldest not. <sup>19</sup>This spake he, signifying by what death he should glorify God. And when he had spoken this, he saith unto him, Follow me.



#### **PRAYER**

#### RENUNCIATION OF SIN

- P I ask you to reject sin, profess your faith in Christ, and confess the faith of the church.
- P Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy the LORD? Ashley and Adrien, Mackenzie and Mathieu: I renounce them.
- **P** Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? **Ashley and Adrien, Mackenzie and Mathieu: I renounce them.**
- **P** Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? **Ashley and Adrien, Mackenzie and Mathieu: I renounce them.**

#### PROFESSION OF FAITH

**P** Do you turn to Christ as your Lord and Savior? **Ashley and Adrien, Mackenzie and Mathieu: I do.** 

Stand. The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

- P With the whole church, let us confess our faith.
- **P** Do you believe in God the Father?
- **Q** I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- P Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
- P Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- **I** believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the

#### life everlasting. Amen.

#### PRAYER FOR ELOÏSE

#### THANKSGIVING AND BLESSING OF WATER

During the Thanksgiving of the water, several gestures are made which help illustrate the meaning of Baptism. The water is divided with the sign of the cross at the mention of the Trinitarian name, and a small quantity is poured out from each quadrant remembering that we are commanded to go to all nations to baptize. Recalling the Spirit's hovering over the waters at creation, the presiding minister blows on the water forming the sign of the cross at the invocation of the Holy Spirit.

- **P** The Lord be with you.
- **And also with you.**

- **P** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- **Q** It is right to give him thanks and praise.
- P Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: We give you thanks, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and you created heaven and earth. By the gift of water you nourish and sustain us and all living things. By the waters of the flood you condemned the wicked and saved those whom you had chosen, Noah and his family. You led Israel by the pillar of cloud and fire through the sea, out of slavery into the freedom of the promised land. In the waters of the Jordan your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. By the baptism of his own death and resurrection your beloved Son has set us free from the bondage to sin and death, and has opened the way to the joy and freedom of everlasting life. He made water a sign of the kingdom and of cleansing and rebirth. In obedience to his command, we make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of + the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. (The Minister divides the waters with the sign of the Cross.)

(Invocation) Pour out your Holy Spirit, so that Eloïse who is here baptized may be given new life. Wash away the sin of all those who are cleansed by this water and bring them forth as a inheritors of your glorious kingdom.

To you be given praise and honor and worship through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

#### HOLY BAPTISM

P Eloïse, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the ♣ Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

#### LAYING ON OF HANDS AND PRAYER FOR THE SPIRIT

P God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we give you thanks for freeing your sons and daughters from the power of sin and for raising them up to a new life through this holy sacrament. Pour your Holy Spirit upon Eloïse: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence. Amen.

#### ANOINTING AND SIGN OF THE CROSS

P Eloïse, child of God, you have been sealed with the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

#### SALT

P Remember the words of the Lord Jesus to his disciples: "You are the salt of the earth."

Eloïse, receive the salt, symbol of wisdom, creature of God for the preservation of the creatures of God. May you be preserved to the day of Christ's coming.

#### **BAPTISMAL CANDLE**

P Remember the words of the Lord Jesus to his disciples: "You are the light of the world."

Eloïse, receive this burning light, and when our Lord Jesus shall come to claim his own, may you greet him with all the saints and live under him in his kingdom forever and ever.

#### **SCRIPTURE**

P Remember the words of St. Peter: You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

#### **WELCOME**

- P Through Baptism God has made Eloïse a member of the priesthood we all share in Christ Jesus, that we may proclaim the praise of God and bear his creative and redeeming Word to all the world.







### Preface for Easter

P It is indeed right and salutary that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to you, O Lord, holy Father, almighty and everliving God. But chiefly are we bound to praise you for the glorious resurrection of our Lord; for he is the true Passover Lamb who gave himself to take away our sin, who by his death has destroyed death, and by his rising has brought us to eternal life. And so with Mary Magdalene and Peter and all the witnesses of the resurrection, with earth and sea and all their creatures, and with angels and archangels, cherubim and seraphim, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:





#### Eucharistic Prayer II

P You are indeed holy, O God, the fountain of all holiness; you bring light from darkness, life from death, speech from silence. We worship you for our lives and for the world you give us. We thank you for the new world to come and for the love that will rule all in all. We praise you for the grace shown to Israel, your chosen, the people of your promise: the rescue from Egypt, the gift of the promised land, the memory of the fathers, the homecoming from exile, and the prophets' words that will not be in vain. In all this we bless you for your only-begotten Son, who fulfilled and will fulfill all your promises.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

## Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.


Therefore, O God, with this bread and cup we remember the incarnation of your Son: his human birth and the covenant he made with us. We remember the sacrifice of his life: his eating with outcasts and sinners, and his acceptance of death. But chiefly on this day we remember his rising from the tomb, his ascension to the seat of power, and his sending of the holy and life-giving Spirit. We cry out for the resurrection of our lives, when Christ will come again in beauty and power to share with us the great and promised feast.

### Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

P Send now, we pray, your Holy Spirit, that we and all who share in this bread and cup may be united in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, may enter the fullness of the kingdom of heaven, and may receive our inheritance with all your saints in light.

P Join our prayers with those of your servants of every time and every place, and unite them with the ceaseless petitions of our great high priest until he comes as victorious Lord of all.


