ear Members and Friends of Immanuel Lutheran Church, I have always loved Transfiguration Sunday. That glimpse into the true godly nature of Jesus Christ, even as he walks his way of the cross, is a stunning glimpse, full of glory for Him and encouragement for us.

But nowadays, I love Transfiguration Sunday even more because of its connection in my mind with Pastor Thomas Nelson Green, of blessed memory. Pastor Green preached for us on a major anniversary for our church: Transfiguration Sunday, 2013 — the 150th anniversary of our congregation. He called us a "house of transfiguration":
