A Word from Pastor Gregory Fryer

The Sermon on the Mount

ear Members and Friends of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Year A in our three-year lectionary does a good job at leading us through Matthew 5 — the first of three chapters in our Lord's golden sermon. So, your preachers — Pastor Carol, Vicar Lara, and me — are eager for this Epiphany Season and its focus on the Sermon.

After that we want to do something unheard of in my ministry: We want to set aside the summertime lectionary Gospel Lessons in order to continue preaching on the Sermon. There is honorable precedent for this: patristic preachers preached this way. They would preach their way through whole books of the Bible. Lutherans tend to follow a lectionary, with its appointed Bible readings Sunday by Sunday. But I note that Martin Luther himself sometimes preached in the patristic manner. Volumes 23, 24, and 25 in *Luther's Works* are called "Sermons on St. John." In 1537, Luther's pastor, Bugenhagen, headed off to Denmark to help introduce the Reformation there, leaving Luther in charge of the preaching and ministry in Wittenberg. Luther, then, preached in a continual manner upon St. John's Gospel for his Saturday sermons.

Our plan is to preach on Matthew 5 during the Epiphany Season now upon us. Then we will return to the lectionary for Lent, Holy Week, and the Easter Season. But then, in the summertime, we mean to preach our way through Matthew 6 and 7.

Pastor Carol, Vicar Lara, and I join many of you in loving our Lord's Sermon the Mount. We are eager for this steady immersion in the Sermon, and we pray that it will prove good for our souls, each and every one of us.
