July-August 2023 A Word from Pastor Gregory Paul Fryer

The Sermon on the Mount, Continued

Lectio continua

Pear Members and Friends of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Your preachers here at Immanuel have resolved to preach on the whole Sermon on the Mount. We are happy about this — to preach on our Lord's Golden Sermon. Our three-year lectionary does a pretty good job of covering The Sermon, but not a perfect job. Over the course of three years we can hear all of Matthew Chapter 5, and a good stretch of Chapter 6, but not much of Chapter 7. That means that the lectionary never invites us to preach on such passages as these:

- + ⁹Pray then like this: Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name... (Matthew 6:9ff, RSV)
- + ¹Judge not, that you be not judged. (Matthew 7:1, RSV)
- + ⁷Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. (Matthew 7:7, RSV)
- + ¹³Enter by the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is easy, that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. ¹⁴For the gate is narrow and the way is hard, that leads to life, and those who find it are few. (Matthew 7:13-14, RSV)

+ ¹⁷So, every sound tree bears good fruit, but the bad tree bears evil fruit. ¹⁸A sound tree cannot bear evil fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit. (Matthew 7:17-18, RSV)

And so it is that in thirty years of preaching, I have never preached on "Enter by the narrow gate." Indeed, I guess I *never will* unless, as we mean to do now, we depart from the Revised Common Lectionary for a while.

If we had reached the Seventh Sunday after Epiphany earlier this year, we would have heard all of Matthew Chapter 5. But as sometimes happens, we moved directly from Epiphany 6 to Transfiguration Sunday. That means that we missed Matthew 5:38-48, concerning retaliation and love of enemies. So that is where we will pick up now. Here is our preaching schedule for July and August:

There is good historical precedent for departing from the lectionary at least some of the time. The church fathers did not preach from a lectionary. And so, St. Augustine and St. Chrysostom, for examples, did not preach from a lectionary. Rather they preached according to *Lectio continua*. That means they preached on whole books of the Bible, preaching their way steadily through the sacred book and then moving on to the next book. We have whole volumes of the sermons of Chrysostom, for example, on Matthew, John, and the Epistles of St. Paul. They are wonderful. They are sublime. This summer, then, your preachers will be returning to the pattern of the early days of the church as we preach on our Lord's Sermon on the Mount. Please join us as often as you can.


