Reformation Sunday, October 29th

ear Members and Friends of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Reformation Sunday is my annual chance to talk about Martin Luther. Did you know that Luther did not much brag about himself? In fact, he objected to the idea that Christians should call themselves "Lutherans." It is a famous quote:

I ask that my name be left silent and people not call themselves Lutheran, but rather Christians. Who is Luther? The doctrine is not mine. I have been crucified for no one. St. Paul in 1 Cor. 3:4-5 would not suffer that the Christians should call themselves of Paul or of Peter, but Christian. How should I, a poor stinking bag of worms, become so that the children of Christ are named with my unholy name? It should not be dear friends. Let us extinguish all factious names and be called Christians whose doctrine we have. ("Admonition Against Insurrection,"1522)

Looking ahead to my Reformation Sunday sermon this year, I incline toward the theme that Martin Luther was neither a proud man, nor a humble man, but a *consecrated* man. My good old Noah Webster Dictionary of 1828 gives this definition of "consecrated": "devoted or dedicated to the service and worship of God." That describes Martin Luther. When he was

baptized as a baby, his parents consecrated him to serve and worship our Triune God. And by the conduct of his life Martin Luther consecrated himself to serve and worship our God. He was not perfect in his consecration, and yet he did devote himself to God better than I have so far — probably better than many of us have.

At this point, I am inclined to discuss three examples of Luther's consecration: (1) His life of prayer. (2) His convictions about progress in our spiritual lives. And (3) His will — his last will and testament. This last point — Luther's will — illustrates the consecrated life in even mundane matters like household finances and plans at the end of life.

We love Reformation Sunday here at Immanuel. I hope you can join us each and every Sunday, including Reformation Sunday, October 29, 2023.
