## Regrets

Dear Members and Friends of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Months ago I jotted down my theme for this recent Reformation Sunday: "If only the saints can fight for the good, then nothing will be done, because I bet we all have regrets." As it turned out, I set aside that theme and instead preached on Martin Luther as a consecrated man. Still, I go on thinking about that theme. One pastoral lesson to be learned from Luther's doctrine of justification by faith is that even those of us with regrets can hand those regrets over to Jesus, pick up again, and in the end prove useful to our God.

Back in 1995, at Mickey Mantle's funeral, country-music star Roy Clark picked up his classical guitar and sang "Yesterday, When I Was Young." He sang at the request of Mantle. Here are a few verses from that song:

I ran so fast that time and youth at last ran out I never stopped to think what life was all about And every conversation I can now recall Concerned itself with me and nothing else at all

Yesterday the moon was blue And every crazy day brought something new to do I used my magic age as if it were a wand And never saw the waste and emptiness beyond The game of love I played with arrogance and pride And every flame I lit too quickly, quickly died The friends I made all seemed somehow to drift away And only I am left on stage to end the play

There are so many songs in me that won't be sung I feel the bitter taste of tears upon my tongue The time has come for me to pay for Yesterday, when I was young

Regrets? Yes, I have a few. When I am old, sitting in my rocking chair and thinking back on my ministry, I will probably recall wrong decisions I made and good things I failed to do. So, it might be with each of us. But today is a new day, and Jesus wants us to use this new day well. With him, there is forgiveness of sins and renewal of life. Let us dive in, then, trying to help ourselves, our loved ones, and our church, Immanuel Lutheran Church.


## The Bible: The Big Picture – A Class for All Ages
