Holy Week

ear Members and Friends of Immanuel Lutheran Church,

We have an early Easter this year — March 31. This means that all of Holy Week will soon be upon us. This pinnacle week of church liturgies is a good and holy week. Try with all your might to be with us here at Immanuel.

As I mentioned last year, Organist and Music Director Zac Schurman and I get to live with the Holy Week liturgies far in advance, trying to plan things so that we can all worship with quiet and undistracted minds. That means, for example, that I have been able to work my way through every word of St. Mark's Passion story — a story we will read and sing on Palm Sunday. I think of that passage where Peter goes out and weeps. He has denied his Lord three



times. And then we all sing "Ah, Holy Jesus, How Hast Thou Offended," including this moving line:

Who was the guilty? Who brought this upon thee? Alas, my treason, Jesus, hath undone thee. 'Twas I, Lord Jesus, I it was denied thee; I crucified thee. (LBW 123, verse 2)

Again, I think of that rugged cross I carry up the center aisle on Good Friday. I wonder whether I will be able to carry it this year. I am not as strong as I used to be.

But chiefly I think of that early morning visit of Mary Magdalene to the tomb. Our risen Jesus calls her by name, "Mary." He calls her in a friendly way. I am eager to hear Jesus call my name someday. Easter gives us such hope in this world!

Please attend as many of these good services as you can. God bless you all.
